

Why Should We Recycle?

Recycling helps earth! Recycling one ton of newspaper saves 17 trees, 7000 gallons of water, 3 cubic yards of landfill space, 4100 Kilowatts of energy, and 60 pounds of air pollutants. Newspapers can be recycled 6 to 7 times!

Recycling helps save energy! Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to light a light bulb for three hours or a television for one hour!

Recycling helps air! Recycling a soda can produces 95% less air pollution and uses 95% less electricity.

Recycling helps natural resources! Recycling one ton of glass saves 1,330 pounds of sand, 433 pounds of soda ash, 433 pounds of limestone, and 151 pounds of feldspar.

Recycling helps the economy! An aluminum can recycled today will be back on the grocery shelf in about 45 days!

1. Get Your Tote

3 sizes of tote are available:

96 Gallon: Best for larger households (3+) or very active recyclers

64 Gallon: Best for households with 2-3 people, or very active recycling couples

48 Gallon: Best for smaller households (1-2) people

Please contact us for the cost of private curbside recycling, billed quarterly, with bi-weekly service.

2. Load the Tote

Put your recyclables in the tote. Eagle Enterprises Recycling, Inc. has one of the most comprehensive lists of accepted materials of any program available.

Corrugated Cardboard (*including cereal boxes, Kleenex boxes, etc.*)

Hardback Books

3rd Class or Junk Mail

Aluminum Cans

Aluminum Foil

Plastics #1-#5, #7 (no #6)

Rigid Plastics #2, #4, #5—Little Tykes, 5-gallon Buckets (Clean but NO TAR BUCKETS), Milk Crates, Plastic Tubs, Corrugated Plastic Signs

Clear, Brown, and Green Glass Beverage/Food Containers

3. Place Tote at the Curb

On the designated day, by 7 a.m., place the tote at the curb with the lid opening towards the road.

Eagle Enterprises Recycling, Inc. will collect the recyclables and take them to our Material Recovery Facility (MRF) in Galva for sorting, baling and shipment to mills for further processing.
